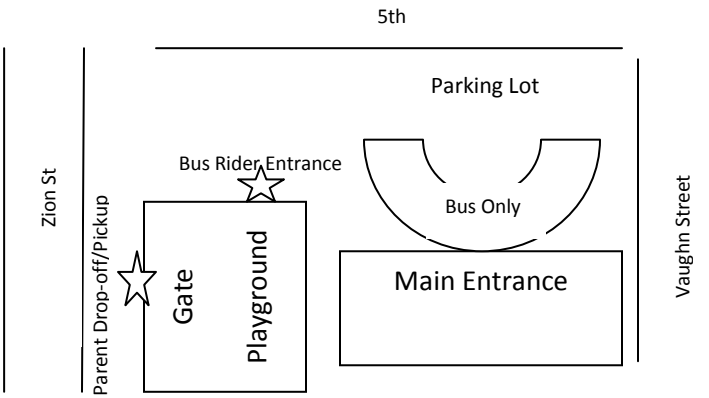


Arrival and Dismissal Procedures



- All students who walk, or are brought to school should enter and exit through the gate located on Zion St. Parents are asked to drop students at the gate and not enter the playground area.
- All students who ride the bus should enter the school grounds through the gate located near the bus zone. No cars should enter the parking lot or bus zone prior to 7:40am. Bus students exit the building through various locations and will be accompanied by staff for dismissal.
- The gate will be closed at 7:40am when the first bell rings- students who arrive late should then enter through the main entrance.

School Dress Code

It is our belief that a school dress code offers the best chance for consistency in an environment that focuses on learning. To maintain our high standards and to provide an environment that focuses on learning, the following are guidelines set by the Sixth Avenue staff and the School Accountability Committee. When a question arises about appropriate dress, administration will make the final determination.

- Clothing with lettering or graphics making reference to alcohol, tobacco, drugs, or otherwise objectionable words or pictures, including double meanings, should be left at home
- Clothing and/or accessories with any type of gang affiliation are not acceptable
- Head coverings are not acceptable unless a form of religious expression or for medical concerns
- All tops and bottoms should be worn so the undergarments are not exposed; no sagging or spaghetti straps
- All tops should cover the body leaving no midriff
- Shorts, skorts, dresses, skirts should be longer than mid-thigh
- Make-up, including lip-gloss, should be left at home
- Large and spikey jewelry poses a safety hazard and should be left at home
- Sunglasses should be kept in backpacks
- Appropriate flat shoes include tennis shoes, boots, casual shoes, and sandals.
- Hair coloring should be natural shades such as brown, blonde, or black.

All students are responsible for articles of clothing. There is a lost and found box for unclaimed articles of clothing in the building. Unclaimed articles of clothing are donated every other week. If you want to ensure that your items get back to you, please label your tags of outer garments with your child's name.
